

Key Dates

- Monday 6 September is a staff training day, meaning that the school is closed to pupils.
- We will be testing Year 7 pupils (those with consent) on **Tuesday 7 September.**
- Our new Year 7 intake start school at 8.40am on Wednesday 8 September. They will be the only pupils in school that day, with the exception of Year 11 prefects. Pupils should report to the Main Yard at 8.35am, where they will be met by Mr Moore, Miss Hood, Mrs Moore, Mrs Bingham and form tutors. School will finish at the normal time of 2.45pm. We will be sending a text to parents and carers in advance of Wednesday with details of tutor groups.

On the first morning, pupils will have their first assembly, will be organised into tutor groups and will receive their timetables. We understand that it will take pupils a little while to get used to new systems and routines. There will be a tour of the school on the first day and teachers and Year 11 prefects will be on hand to support pupils throughout their first week. One of the things that can take a little time is getting used to the new day structure, which is outlined below. From September, pupils will no longer be in 'bubbles' and will move around the school, from lesson to lesson, as normal.

Lunchtime

The lunch period for pupils in Year 7 is from $\underline{12.30 \text{ until } 1.00 \text{ pm}}$. For the first half term, Year 7 will be dismissed ten minutes early to facilitate their passage through the Food Court. A two-course meal is currently priced at £2.20. Children in receipt of free school meals will have the value of the meal credited to their accounts on a daily basis.

We operate a cashless catering system which recognises children by fingerprints. Throughout the first couple of days, all pupils in Year 7 (with consent) will be registered on the school's biometric database. This is the quickest and most secure way of paying for school lunch. Pupils can 'top-up' their accounts using the machines in the Food Court and in the Technology corridor on Level 1. Alternatively, lunch, as well as payments for school trips, can be made via '*ParentPay'*, accessible from our website. For the initial registration, parents/carers will require an activation code. We will be issuing letters containing codes on Tuesday 7 September, as this can't be done until children are officially on roll on 6th September.

<u>Please note that pupils in Year 7 must remain on site over the lunch period</u>. If you have a specific reason for wanting your child to go home for their lunch, please contact your child's Head of Key Stage or Head of Learning to discuss the matter.

There will be further information shared with pupils over the course of the first week.
