Dear Parent/Carer

As we approach the end of term, I would like to take this opportunity to share with you pupils' achievements and whole-school events from the Autumn Term, as well providing you with some key dates for our return in January.

KEY DATES



- As parents and carers are aware, school will finish at 12.00pm on Friday 17 of December.
- Monday 3 January is a Bank Holiday, so the school will be closed.
- Tuesday 4 January is a staff training day, meaning that the school is closed to pupils.
- Testing for pupils in Years 7, 10 and 11 will take place on Wednesday 5 January, with pupils in those year groups returning to school on Thursday 6 January at the normal time. Testing will be done in batches, with times to be sent out to parents/carers before Wednesday 5 January.
- Testing for pupils in Years 8 and 9 takes place on Thursday 6 January. Again, specific times will be sent out to parents/carers in the new year.
- All pupils will be in school on Friday 7 January at the normal time.
- Pupils break up for half term on Friday 18 February, returning on Monday 28 February.
- We break up for the Easter holidays on Thursday 8 April, with pupils returning to school on Monday 25 April.

STAFF AND GOVERNOR NEWS



After almost two decades of leading the Governing Body, our Chair of Governors is retiring at the end of term. He was instrumental in steering the school through the Building Schools for the Future Programme in the mid-2000s. The fantastic facilities the school has today were secured under his leadership. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Chair of Governors for his dedicated service to the school and for his unwavering commitment in ensuring the very best for our pupils. We wish him well in his retirement.

Another of our governors, who has given 25 years of dedicated service to the school, is also retiring at the end of term. We acknowledge her huge contribution to the education and well-being of several generations of young people in our local community.

Mrs Edmonson, who has been a governor since 1998, is also stepping down at Christmas. Mrs Edmondson has been an active member of the Governing Body and a key member of its sub-committee. We wish Mrs Edmondson a happy retirement.

We thank all 3 governors for the significant contribution they have made to the school and local community and wish them all well for the future.

Councillor Adam Ellison, a former pupil of the school, will take over as Chair of Governors in January. Mr Ellison is Councillor for Hebburn North and Lead Cabinet Member for Children, Young People and Families at South Tyneside Council.











Mrs Coyne is stepping down from her position of Vice Chair of Governors at the end of term, but she will remain on the Governing Board. Mr G Thompson will be Acting Vice Chair of Governors from January.

Miss Robinson, who is part of our Classroom Assistant team, is sadly leaving us at Christmas to pursue a different career. We thank her for her contribution to the school and wish her well for the future.

EXPECTATIONS FOR THE NEW TERM

Basic Equipment



A huge thank you to parents and carers for your support with basic equipment throughout the term. Pupils are coming to school fully equipped for learning, which is wonderful to see. Pupils should continue to bring their basic equipment with them every day in the new term.

What is meant by the term 'basic equipment'?

The following items of stationery constitute your child's 'basic equipment': a blue or black pen, pencil, ruler, green pen and planner. Your child is expected to bring all of these items with them to school every day. They should also have a school bag to carry books, folders, homework and PE kit.

What happens if my child forgets or loses their basic equipment?

Equipment checks will take place at the start of each new school day. If your child is missing their basic equipment, or any part of it, they will be issued with a detention during period 1. At the start of each new lesson, your child will be asked to place their basic equipment on their desk to show that they are prepared for the lesson and ready to learn. Our prefect team will continue to run a stationery shop every day, on morning entry, so that missing items can be replaced promptly and inexpensively. Please refer to the price list below for further information. The stationery shop can be found in the packed lunch area every morning from 8.30am.

Why does my child need these items every day?

It is hugely important that children are prepared for learning. As part of our marking policy, your child will be required to use a green pen when self-assessing and/or developing work marked by their teachers. We also have high expectations in relation to how classwork should be presented. For example, pupils will need a ruler to underline the date and title, and a pencil for any diagrams or sketches that may need to be recorded in their books. Planners will be used to record homework and to help pupils ensure that homework is handed in on time; they will also be used to track individual attendance percentages on a weekly basis.

UNIFORM



As a school, we have high expectations in relation to all aspects of school life, including the wearing of school uniform. It gives pupils a sense of belonging and is an important part of our corporate image. We encourage pupils to have a sense of pride in their own personal appearance and particularly in the

wearing of school uniform, which is looked upon as their *badge of membership* of Hebburn Comprehensive School. We ask for your full support in ensuring that your child always wears the correct uniform. It is important that staff are not wasting valuable teaching and learning time dealing with issues relating to uniform.

Some important reminders:

- Blazers are a compulsory part of school uniform. They should not be replaced with an alternative outer layer/jacket.
- Leggings are <u>not</u> part of school uniform.
- Tube skirts/elasticated skirts are not acceptable. School skirts should be knee length.
- Pupils are required to wear <u>black</u>, <u>polishable footwear</u>; canvas/material footwear is not permitted. As you are already aware, boots are not allowed.
- No false, gel or acrylic nails.
- No false eyelashes.
- No jewellery.

KEY PROJECT


