Dear All,

As we approach the end of term, I would like to take this opportunity to share with you pupils' achievements and whole-school events from the Spring Term, as well providing you with some key dates for our return after Easter.

KEY DATES



- Pupils return after Easter on Monday 15 April. All pupils must be on their allocated yard for 8.30am, ready for line-ups.
- Monday 6 May is a Bank Holiday (school closed).
- Pupils finish at the normal time on Friday 24 May for half term, returning on Monday 3 June.
- There is a staff training day on Friday 5 July, meaning that the school is closed to pupils.
- School finishes on Friday 19 July. I will write to parents with further information nearer the time.
- We will communicate arrangements for the collection of GCSE results in the next half term.

EXPECTATIONS FOR THE NEW TERM

Basic Equipment

A huge thank you to parents and carers for your support with basic equipment throughout the term. Pupils should continue to bring their basic equipment with them every day in the new term. Pupils in Years 7-9 must remember to bring their learning packs to school each morning. This helps to instill a sense of responsibility and allows lessons to proceed without disruption.

What is meant by the term 'basic equipment'?

The following items of stationery constitute your child's 'basic equipment': a blue or black pen, pencil, ruler and green pen. Your child is expected to bring all of these items with them to school every day. They should also have a school bag to carry books, folders, homework and their PE kit.

What happens if my child forgets or loses their basic equipment?

Equipment checks will take place at the start of each new school day. If your child is missing their basic equipment, or any part of it, they will be issued with a C2, which is a same-day, after-school detention. Our prefect team will continue to run a stationery shop every day, on morning entry, so that missing items can be replaced promptly and inexpensively. There will be a smaller shop in the Morning Meetings for Years 8 and 9.

Why does my child need these items every day?

It is hugely important that children are prepared for learning. As part of our marking policy, your child will be required to use a green pen when self-assessing and/or developing work marked by their teachers. We also have high expectations in relation to how classwork should be presented. For example, pupils will need a ruler to underline the date and title, and a pencil for any diagrams or sketches that may need to be recorded in their books.

UNIFORM

As a school, we have high expectations in relation to all aspects of school life, including the wearing of school uniform. It gives pupils a sense of belonging and is an important part of our corporate image. It is important that staff are not wasting valuable teaching and learning time dealing with issues relating to uniform.

Some important reminders:

- Blazers are a compulsory part of school uniform. They should not be replaced with an alternative outer layer/jacket.
- Leggings are **not** part of school uniform.
- Tube skirts/elasticated skirts are not acceptable. School skirts should be **knee length and follow** school policy.
- Pupils are required to wear <u>black, polishable footwear</u>; canvas/material footwear is not permitted. As you are already aware, boots are not allowed.
- No false, gel or acrylic nails.
- No false eyelashes.
- No jewellery, with the exception of a watch.

- Well done to all our Key Stage 3 pupils who took part in the Centre for Advanced Training (CAT) Dance workshop!














February


